- + **Appendix:** Feel free to add photos of your stay(s) abroad at the end of the report if this helps with understanding the report better. Please make sure that the total data size of the email does not exceed 5 MB.
- + Length: approx. 3,600 words (this usually corresponds to a continuous text of 9 DIN A4 pages)

Format:

The purpose of the reflection report for elective 1 "Intercultural Involvement" is to answer the guiding questions below by writing down and reflecting on the experiences and impressions you have gained during your involvement. Please answer the questions in a continuous text. This is not an academic paper as you know it from your studies, but a reflective report focusing on your personal experience as a volunteer.

Please note: Your *unpaid* involvement in elective 1 should have an intercultural focus. If you have been involved in more than one project as a student, you can of course refer to the different activities and experiences in your report and compare them if necessary.

- + First, please introduce the project/association/institution in which you have been involved or are still volunteering. Please also describe the duration and scope of your involvement as well as your tasks.
- + Why did you choose this project?
- + What were your expectations before you started to volunteer?
- + Have you done any preparation for your involvement? If so, what did you do to prepare yourself for it?
- + Is there any advice you wish you had received before your involvement that would have helped you to to be ready? If so, what was it?
- + What challenges did you face during your involvement? How did you overcome these challenges?
- Have you developed specific strategies to deal with cultural differences and intercultural challenges?
 If so, could you please give an example of a situation on how you have used these strategies?
- + Did you further develop your social and communication skills during your involvement? Please specify.
- + How have these skills affected your intercultural understanding and international competence?
- + What skills do you think are necessary in order to be "successful" in volunteering or to have a positive volunteering experience?
- + What have you learned through volunteering that you probably would not have learned in (theoretical) courses at university?
- + What do you see as the potential of cultural diversity?
- + Were you able to apply the knowledge gained in the other CIIC electives in your involvement? Please specify.
- + Which insights from the introductory course and the reflection workshop (mandatory courses in elective 1) did you find useful for your reflection process?
- + Were there moments when you became aware that your actions may have been influenced by prejudices or stereotypes? If so, how did you react?
- + In your opinion, what role does awareness of power structures and social justice play in volunteering?
- + What highlights or special experiences did you have during your involvement? How did these experiences impact your personal growth and intercultural competence?
- + Did you build networks during your involvement? If so, which ones?
- + How can you apply the knowledge you gained during your involvement to your daily work? How can the experience and networks you gained during your volunteering to benefit your studies and career?

- + Where do you see the added value of social commitment?
- + What advices can you give other students about volunteering?
- + Looking back, have your expectations of the involvement been fulfilled? Please explain why (why not).
- + What is your personal conclusion?

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
