

Safety aspects – a matter of priority

- Safety aspects are very important to consider, both in the preparation phase as well as during your stay abroad.
- No matter where you travel, your personal safety, health and security should be your top priority.
- Think about....
 - How is the **security situation** in your destination country and how do you have to adapt your behaviour to avoid critical situations?
 - How are the **health conditions** and do you need to take specific medicine or vaccinations?







Quick tips

- Check the travel advice and safety precautions of the ederal Foreign Office
 (Auswärtiges Amt) to see the most recent assessment of the security situation
 in your country of destination.
- Get advice locally about areas of risk and security concerns.
- Know who to contact in case of an emergency.
- Avoid protests and demonstrations, and do not take photographs of sensitive buildings or security personnel.
- Stay alert at all times and take extra measures to protect your personal security.
- Leave your itinerary and travel plans with family or friends so they know your approximate location at a given time.





Crime

You should always take sensible precautions to protect yourself and your belongings → simple guidelines:

- Carry your credit card, tickets and money separately, and leave spare cash and valuables in a safe place.
- Don't carry your passport unless absolutely necessary and leave a photocopy of your passport (and travel and insurance documents) with family or friends at home.
- Avoid showing large sums of money or wearing valuable **jewellery** in public.
- Don't use **ATMs** after dark, especially if you're alone. Check no one has followed you after withdrawing cash.
- Keep a close eye on your personal belongings in public places, such as internet cafes, train and bus stations.
- Avoid dark and unlit streets, stairways and parks.

Important numbers

- Police number of destination country
- Rescue services number of destination country
- Bank's card cancellation number
- Mobile operator cancellation number
- 24h emergency number of
 - your liability insurance
 - health insurance and
 - accident insurance including insurance policy number

Keep these numbers in a document in your **Drop Box**, send a copy to your **contact person at home** and leave a copy in your **luggage**. If you want to be completely sure, send yourself an **email** with the appropriate information that you can retrieve in case of an emergency or damage.





Covid-19 Pandemic

- Your health and safety are the biggest priority especially due to COVID-19!
- Before going abroad, be sure to get information about your destination country's...
 - ... current (travel) restrictions
 - ... general situation
 - ... **entry requirements** and **quarantining rules**, e.g. through the Federal Foreign Office website
- Be sure to have sufficient (travel and health) insurance that also applies in pandemics and countries with a travel warning
- Be responsible and **stick to the well-known rules** of distancing, hygiene, wearing facemasks, regular airing of rooms and other rules that apply in your destination country!
- If in doubt, you can also **start your Erasmus-Mobility virtually from home** please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any questions on this!

- ATM fees: Before leaving the country, it's always smart to check with your bank to see what ATM fees to expect.
- Bank account: make sure to check whether you will need a local bank account and if yes, what kind of documents you need to open it.
- **Visa:** if you have a non-European nationality, check the visa requirements at your home Embassy for your destination country.
- Financial support by your destination country:
 some countries provide students with extra financial benefits.
 e.g. France (rent allowance by CAF).
 Make sure to inform yourself on time!
