### PREPARATIONS FOR THE STAY ABROAD

#### **How did you find out about the Baden-Württemberg-STIPENDIUM?**

The seniors from the same university course got the BWS for their stay abroad in previous semesters. They shared the details on what it is and how to apply for it.

#### **Did you have contact with other scholarship holders of the Baden-Württemberg-STIPENDIUM before you left or abroad? Did you participate in an event (e.g. summer festival or annual meeting) of the Baden-Württemberg-STIPENDIUM before or during your stay?**

When I was still in my home country, I contacted some previous scholarship holders which were also from my hometown to seek some information about the scholarship on how it works, what benefits it provides to us, etc. The events were mostly taken place online and unfortunately, I could not attend the events due to my personal issues and my timetable was packed. I would gladly attend some of the interesting events if I am given the chance again for the scholarship next semester.

### STUDYING AT THE HOST UNIVERSITY

#### **At which host university did you spend your semester abroad? Why did you choose this university in this country?**

The course in the home country is a partnership program with Hochschule Karlsruhe (HsKA). Students will be given the chances every year to do student exchange program here. I chose to come here as it was my first time going to Europe. Besides, HsKA is an applied sciences university where I can gain technical knowledge with the advanced facilities here.

#### **Were there any major differences compared to your home university? What were they?**

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, I can only speak in terms of the teaching styles by the professors and the working attitudes of the German students while working together on a project. Even though everything is conducted online, we still had the chances to experience the professional lectures conducted by the professors and the detailed information from them when the students asked them questions. Apart from that, we had to do an international project with the German students here. They were really committed and the way they conducted the project was well-planned and constructed.

### **How did you prepare for your stay abroad?**

I consulted my seniors who came here last year regarding the daily life, things that we have to take care of, what we should bring, etc. so that there are no problems faced during the stay here.

### **Would you recommend the host university to other students? Why or why not?**

I strongly recommend HsKA to other students as you can not only learn a lot from the professors and the students here, you can also socialize with students from other countries with different backgrounds because everyone is staying together in the student hostels. Many activities can be organized together. Such opportunity is rare and should be experienced by everyone at least once in his/her life.

### **LIFE IN YOUR HOST COUNTRY**

#### **Was it difficult to find your way in the host country? What surprised you the most?**

Everything seems to be fine now as I have adapted to the environment here. What surprised me the most when I first came here is how the people here communicate to each other. They talk in a pretty high voice volume and they are really straightforward which I could not get used to that at first. People are also distant and refuse to make eye contacts with each other. Nevertheless, once they break down the barriers, they can be really helpful and friendly which I find them respectable and cool. Other than that, people here are environmental-friendly as they use their own recycle bags instead of the plastic bags when buying grocery in the market. I was overwhelmed because I had to keep the items into the bag fast and the staff scanned the items really quick. Sometimes people queuing at the back looked impatient if we do it slow. Luckily, after few days of training everything went well after that.

#### **Which experience do you remember particularly well?**

When I first reached here with my other Malaysian friends, we had to buy some daily stuff from the market. It was at the epidemic peak of COVID-19 and some people looked avoiding and despised on us. We even got

called 'Corona' once by a random person in the street. I believe that only a small amount of people behave like that because of the people here are friendly and helpful. Furthermore, we had some good moments with the international and local students here by going to the Schlossgarten, having dinner together, singing songs together, etc. These experiences will not be forgotten as they are really valuable.




Figure 6, 7 & 8: Travelling to Titisee and Frankfurt
