Each week topics from the fields of culture, politics and economics are presented, in some cases jointly developed, and discussed. Current events in Germany are also taken into account. Course participants read articles, do their own research and discuss the texts and topics. Various topics are dealt with, for example: overcoming the German-German division, the political system with federalism and the multi-party system, integration of migrants, approaches to environmental protection and German festivals and traditions.</b>
